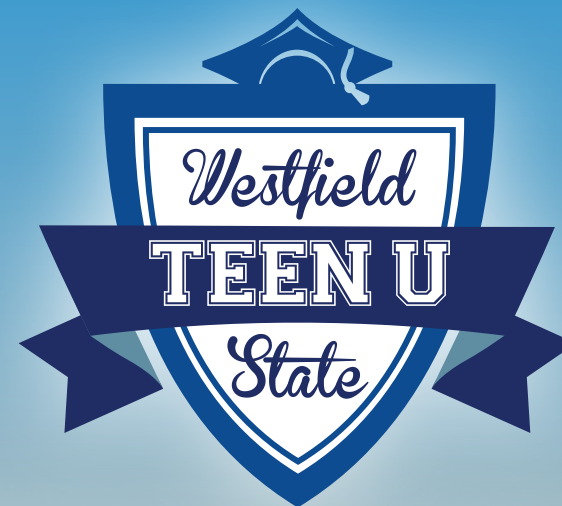

If you are interested in a career in health care, join the H.E.L.P. program at Westfield State University and learn about the many exciting fields available to you including doctor, nurse, physician assistant, physical therapist, phlebotomist, EMT, and more!

You will spend a week living on campus at Westfield State and participate in hands-on learning and observations, both on-campus and at a local hospital. This program will introduce you to many health care fields and is taught by full-time faculty members from our Physician Assistant Program and Nursing, Movement Science, and Health Science departments.

Join future crime scene investigators at Westfield CSI to investigate and solve a “murder” on campus! You and your team will live on campus for one week and discover the latest in crime scene investigation technology.

Westfield CSI, winner of the “Innovative and Creative Program” award by the University Professional and Continuing Education Association (UPCEA) in 2012, gives high school students the chance to learn about criminal justice, forensic science, investigations, and technology while experiencing life at a university campus.

Westfield CSI includes:

- Viewing and investigating mock crime scenes
- Crime scene processing
- DNA analysis
- Analysis of hair, fibers, and tool impressions
- Fingerprinting techniques
- Interviewing skills
- Crime scene reporting
- Law and the judicial process

The only requirements to join the team are your interest in solving our mystery crime and desire to experience college life first hand.
