

Collect as many geocaches as you can within the time frame. To prove that you found a cache, take a selfie with it at its location. The top group will win some Westfield State Swag. Bring your evidence to the Geography, Planning & Sustainability Office (Wilson 203).

1. Stanley's Peninsula

N 42° 07.364' W 072° 47.694'

Rocks, roots, leaves, pine needles and minor ups and downs, water on 3 sides at times. You DO NOT have to cross on any logs. You follow the GPS too soon you will meet the swamp monster. There is a trail to cache area. As you approach the boardwalk, turn left just before it. The cache is an oversized medicine container (Hint: Look Up).

2. Evergreen

N 42° 07.415' W 072° 48.124'

The cache is well hidden, but the terrain is very easy. The cache is a small rubber maid container, it's in a very nice location, but you have to walk off the trail about 100-150 feet to find it. The cache contains a logbook, pen, a couple of goodies (Hint: Is it in one tree? Or is it in 4 trees?).

3. Cally - Man

N 42° 07.401' W 072° 48.286'

Follow the blue trail and you will walk right into it. The cache is a regular size ammo container (Hint: You might just walk OVER it so beware of the trolls).

4. Beautiful Park

N 42° 07.434' W 072° 47.335'

This is a micro cache that is hanging. You will need to bring a pencil.

5. The Great Wall of Stanley

N 42° 07.432' W 072° 46.850'

The cache is a camo'd pill bottle hidden among the rocks (Hint: Is the end near or are you on top of the world)

6. Elegant Dining

N 42° 07.254' W 072° 47.096'

This cache is a small pill bottle with a log (Hint: Is it time to fire up the grill?)

7. Father Willow

N 42° 07.204' W 072° 47.211'

There is a Great Willow Tree right next to this microcache.
