Steve,

Can you ask for approval of the following judicial changes from the general SGA legislature:

- 1) Change the word "guilty" to "responsible" wherever it occurs in the judicial procedures
- 2) Change the word "prosecute" to "process" or "present" (whichever applies) in the judicial procedures
- 3) Change the Appeals wording from:
 "... may appeal said decision to the College Appeals Board...
 who shall recommend to the President of the College"

to:

"...may appeal said decision to the President of the College... who shall rely upon a College Appeals Board to make recommendations..."

None of these changes effect policy or procedure in any way. I am requesting the first two solely o get away from legal terminology. The later is requested to more clearly outline that the President is responsible for appeal. The proposed language just serves to clarify. It will not change practice or procedure in any way!

Current Alcohol Sanctions:

First Offense

Attendance at Alcohol Education class.

Second Offense

Community service or College probation with a referral to counseling for mandatory evaluation and aftercare.

Third Offense

Suspension from College housing for one (1) academic semester or more with readmission to occur after verification of counseling evaluation and aftercare.

Fourth Offense

Suspension from College for one (1) academic semester or more with readmission to occur after verification of counseling evaluation and aftercare.

Proposed Alcohol Sanctions:

E. Enforcement/Sanctions

 All violators of these regulations will be brought before the student judiciary for disposition of their cases. Alcohol offenses are subject to the following sanctions (each academic year):

<u>First Offense</u>: Attendance at alcohol education classes. (This sanction only applies one time and will <u>not</u> be repeated each year.)

<u>Second Offense</u>: Suspended from campus for three (3) consecutive weekends with a referral to counseling for mandatory evaluation and aftercare.

<u>Third Offense</u>: Suspension from College housing for one (1) academic semester or more with readmission to occur after verification of counseling evaluation and aftercare.

Fourth Offense: Suspension from College for one (1) academic semester or more with readmission to occur after verification of counseling evaluation and aftercare.

<u>Legal Age Alcohol Offenses</u>: Students of legal drinking age shall be subject to the above same sanctions except that for minor offenses such as open container in public area and failure to sign in alcohol, students shall receive a warning before the first level of sanction occurs.

Current Drug Policy

DRUG POLICY

POLICY

- A. Drug Use or Possession
- 1. The Westfield State College Board of Trustees in upholding state laws and regulations and in supporting the mission of the College requires its agents to enforce College regulations regarding the unlawful use or possession of controlled substances, drugs or drug paraphernalia on the Westfield State College campus. Any student found in possession of an illegal drug substance or drug related paraphernalia and found guilty of such possession shall (this applies only to first-time offenders) remain as a student on a probationary

basis provided the student completes a drug rehabilitation program prescribed by the Office of Student Affairs at the student's expense.

- 2. Any student found guilty of a second offense of possession of an illegal drug substance or illegal drug paraphernalia shall be suspended from the College for the remainder of the semester and the next full semester with the possibility of returning to the College pending drug counseling and by the decision of the Vice President, Student Affairs with no right of return after a third offense.
- B. Drug Sale or Distribution
- 1. Any student found guilty of the sale or distribution of controlled substances or drugs on the Westfield State College campus by the College Student Judicial System will immediately be suspended from College for the current semester plus one (1) complete academic year. A student may apply for readmission through regular College procedures on written recommendation from an ad hoc committee of students and administrators appointed by the Student Government Association President and the Vice President, Student Affairs to review the case. The review will include, but not be limited to, documentation from the student that he/she has undergone drug counseling. The student, if readmitted, will be on a probationary status for one (1) year with no right of return after a second offense.
