

## STATE AUTHORIZATION RECIPROCITY AGREEMENT (SARA)

## **COMPLAINT PROCEDURES- Day Online Courses**

<u>IMPORTANT</u>: Massachusetts recently passed legislation to join the National Council for State Authorization Reciprocity Agreements (NC-SARA)

Students enrolled in day online courses who are residents of states other than Massachusetts, and when such state is a SARA participating state, may submit complaints to the Dr. Christina Swaidan by <u>completing the new online form.</u>

Efforts will be made to determine the appropriate course of action, and the student will be notified within 10 days following the receipt of a complaint.

If the attempt to resolve the complaint via internal institutional processes fails, students enrolled in online courses who are residents of states other than Massachusetts, and when such state is a SARA participating state, may appeal the College's decision to the Massachusetts Department of Higher Education which makes complaint forms available on its <u>website</u>.
