OBJECTIVES:

This course is designed to provide an understanding of and an appreciation for the fundamental principles and concepts of modern labor relations.

The course is important to students on several levels:

for other students, those with an interest in but not an ambition in labor relations, this course is important because labor-management relations will directly or indirectly affect almost anyone working in a private or public sector organization.

In this course, we will study the background and theory of labor relations, analyze those factors and apply them to solve specific cases. We will combine text, other readings, motion pictures, videos, simulations, class discussions and case analysis.
