MSW Information

Advanced Standing Full-Time (one year) Program

Course Registration:

The program of study outlines which classes you will take each semester. The current course schedule for the fall will be available online.

As a full-time Advanced Standing student, you will need to register for the following fall classes:

SOCW 0621 Mental Health and Children SOCW 06xx Hybrid Elective SOCW 06xx Elective (hybrid or online) SOCW 0643 Practice with Families SOCW 0661 Advanced Practicum I

Please review your entire program of study located at the end of this document.

*Full-time Advanced Standing students will attend classes on Monday and Thursday evenings between 5:15-9:00 pm.

Summer Bridge Course:

As an Advanced Standing student, *you are required to take* a summer bridge course here at WSU. This class is an online class that begins on July 5th and ends August 16th. This class is listed on the CGCE page at the university website in the Summer II listing. Registration information is also available on that webpage. You will receive an email in your WSU email account with information regarding registration dates.

Field Practicum:

As a full-time student, you will be in a field placement this coming fall. To begin the field placement process, you need to complete and submit all required Field Internship forms within 10 days of receipt of this electronic MSW handbook. To complete your require Field Orientation and Application Form, please go to MSW Accepted Students webpage: https://westfield.ma.edu/academics/degrees/social-work-msw/msw-accepted-students and scroll down to the section: Field Orientation and Application.

You are welcome to contact the Social Work Field Education Director, Tyrese Tillman via email at ttillman@westfield.ma.edu with any questions regarding the Field Application process. If you do not complete the field application in the required time frame you will lose your full-time status in the program.

Transfer Credits:

If you have taken graduate social work courses from a CSWE accredited MSW program, you may be able to transfer up to 6 graduate credits to the WSU MSW program. To do this, we need an official transcript and a copy of the course syllabus. Once you have the syllabus, please make an appointment with Dr. Farina so we can determine whether your prior courses may be transferred for WSU MSW graduate credit.

MSW Information

Advanced Standing Full-Time (one year) Program

The following procedures and policies must be followed before the Program of Study is considered acceptable toward the Master's Degree. This form must be typed or printed clearly.

- 1. The Program of Study form is developed based on the program and time frame in which you were accepted. After the study plan is reviewed, it must be signed by a) the Program Director, and b) the student.
- 2. Any change in the original program must have the approval of the advisor and the Program Director.
- 3. The Program of Study is developed in adherence to the following policies:
 - a. Students are expected to complete their degree requirements within six (6) years from the date of the first course accredited toward their degree, including transfer credits from other regionally accredited institutions. No credit will be given for a course older than 6 years at the time of graduation.
 - b. No more than nine semester hour credits taken at Westfield State University prior to matriculation may be applied toward the degree. Once (6) semester hours have been earned, Pending Application Waiver must be submitted and approved prior to registering for (3) additional credits. All such credits must be appropriate to your Program of Study and must be approved by your advisor.
 - c. A program of study is designed in consultation with an advisor in accordance with the requirements for a degree in a specific concentration. The advisor is not responsible for his/her advisee's meeting Graduate Division regulations and deadlines. You are personally responsible for knowing and following all university rules and regulations.

4. Academic Integrity

a. Students in the graduate program are expected to have a high standard of integrity. Any graduate student who cheats or plagiarizes on examinations, papers, assignments, or within a research setting is subject to dismissal from the program. Cases involving academic integrity shall be referred to the Dean for adjudication. (See Graduate Catalog & MSW Program Manual).
