



CALL FOR CASE MANAGERS –

BACKGROUND

LIRS is the only child welfare provider working with ORR that provides a full range of services for unaccompanied minors. We view our efforts to assist with the emergency at the southern border as a core facet of meeting our mission. LIRS works to reunify these children with their parents or sponsors and runs the vast majority of sponsor readiness services (85%) around the country.

At present, there is a massive shortage of case managers. This causes backlogs and delays in family reunification, for these case managers are responsible for assessing sponsor readiness and ensuring the safe and timely release of minors.

IMMEDIATE NEEDS

- We are looking for full-time, temporary remote case managers – for an average of 6 to 9 months (although our affiliates could consider hiring these individuals permanently in the longer term)
 - o Note: this means individuals will not be located on-site at intake facilities
- We need to identify/bundle approximately 50 to 100+ case managers ASAP
- We welcome any connections to individuals and/or institutions who can fill, or help to fill, these opens positions

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

- Must be at least 21 years of age and be able to pass an FBI background check, as well as a CA/N check in every state in which they have resided in the last 5 years.
- Staff are also required to have a TB test and be CPR certified.

POSITIONS

Lead Case Manager (Full Time: Job Description - <http://lirs.iapplicants.com/ViewJob-776716.html>)

Responsible for coordinating case management and safe and timely release services, training new case managers, and supervising the work of other case manager.

- Master's degree in social work or behavioral sciences OR
- Bachelor's degree and at least 3 years progressive employment experience that demonstrates supervisory and case management experience
- Bilingual in Spanish and English

Case Manager (Full Time: Job Description - <http://lirs.iapplicants.com/ViewJob-776717.html>)

Assesses the needs of unaccompanied children in care, develops Individual Service Plans, screens for human trafficking concerns, facilitates the safe and timely release or discharge of children and youth, documents the provision of services in case files.
