Westfield State University commemorates Veterans Day this year to pay tribute to our nation's peacekeepers, with a special focus placed on Guard and Reserve members who are coming into their Veteran status during the global pandemic. Because many of our Guard and Reserve members around the world will receive their Veteran status (by federal definition) for the first time, they will celebrate their first Veterans Day. The more than 20,000 National Guard and Reserve members activated across the United States during this year for all reasons are to be recognized as well for their selfless commitment to our country. Today, we honor our military veterans who sacrifice their time to serve the United States in the hopes of maintaining peace and unity.

When coming up with a name for this Veterans Day Celebration, we thought long and hard. The decision was to call it "Got Your Six", because right now, in this moment in time, we need each other. Many civilians have not heard the term, with this in mind, we titled it, "Got Your Back" for civilians and added "Got Your Six" for our military and veterans. In the military, "Got Your Six" means "I've got your back." The saying originated with World War I fighter pilots referencing the rear of an airplane as the six o'clock position. If you picture yourself at the center of a clock face, the area directly in front of you is twelve o'clock. six o'clock is what lies behind you. So, when someone tells you that they've "Got Your Six," it means they're watching your back.

Lisa Ducharme is Westfield State's Veterans and Military Services Coordinator. A Veteran herself who was serving at The Pentagon on 9/11, she wants to raise awareness about the Guard and Reserve members who will come into their veteran status for the first time. Guard and reserve members do not automatically receive veteran status (federal definition), one that comes with benefits.

"When our Guard and Reserve get out of the military," said Ducharme, "they get their separation papers and most go into two years of inactive reserve status. They do not receive transition assistance when they complete their service, so they don't always know what is available to them."

Many are not aware that they qualify for the Veterans Administration Veterans Identification Card, which is a document to show they are a veteran. This Veterans Identification Card is for those who served on active duty and also those who served in the Guard and Reserves. It is a form of photo identification they can use to receive discounts offered to Veterans at participating restaurants, hotels, stores, theme parks, and more.

Congress.gov explains the Honor America's Guard-Reserve Retirees Act. "It provides honorary veteran status to those members of the National Guard or Reserve who have served for 20 years and do not meet the full requirements for veteran status under title 38."

It is important to remember that many of our National Guard and Reserve members, when called to active duty, already have a job or may be enrolled in college, which they may have to leave so they can fulfill their military duties. This affects not only the service member and their families, but the entire community. Many Guard and Reserve members returned to school after they fulfilled their commitment, but to some it is too difficult, or other obligations were prioritized.

During this celebration of our nation's veterans, we remember Paul W. Dower who was with the Army Signal Corps. A veteran and strong supporter of Westfield's Veteran & Military Services, he was an aerial photographer in World War II, where he spent 33 months traveling across England, Africa, and Italy. Ducharme finds comfort in "knowing he can rest in peace leaving this

world in the hands of our future veterans." Sadly, we lost Paul, one of our nation's peacekeepers, this summer at the age of 100.

Celebrating our nation's peacekeepers on Veterans Day will unite people during an unsettled time in our country. Military connectedness comes in many forms like active duty, National Guard, Reserves, veterans, and military family members, and the relationships are important to Ducharme. "Friends may come, friends may go," she said, "but our military-connection is forever."

We have many veterans who continue to serve after they get out of the military, whether they volunteer or start a business to help others. Here are a few resources we have here in MA:

- Veteran Service Officers (VSO), every veteran should reach out to their town VSO before they need them. They can help with everything a veteran need and if they don't have the answer, they can find it.
- VetAir is an organization committed to ensuring that veterans have the necessary travel solutions to and from their medical care appointments free of charge.
- Project New Hope is an organization that offers targeted services and camaraderie to our military family, current or former Service Member and their Family, Gold Star Honoree, or Survivor who has felt the impact of military service.
- The Massachusetts Military Support Foundation opened the Empowerment Center in Agawam. It is a place where veterans and gold star families can go to get free products; everything from food, to clothing to baby supplies.
- Veterans Outreach Into Community Engagement (VOICE) A partnership of federal, state, local, private and non-profit organizations and concerned community members who network through meetings on an on-going basis to share information on resources, events and opportunities that serve the veteran community of Western MASS.

DID YOU KNOW?

From: Civil Unrest, Natural Disasters, and Federal Activation. National Guard and Reservists have been answering the call since the 1600's

Since 2001, thousands of Airmen from Westover have deployed to support the Global War on Terror. At the height of the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan, the base had more than 1,200 people deployed in the theater.

October 2011, in Massachusetts, the National Guard is assisting the Massachusetts Emergency Management Agency in general relief efforts across the commonwealth. More than 400 Guardsmen and Reservists are activated. June 2020 - National Guard Civil Unrest: More than 17,000 troops in 23 states and DC are activated.

July 2020 - 31 states, territories want National Guard and Reservist to stay deployed on coronavirus missions into the fall, possibly Christmas. In addition to coronavirus and protests missions, there are an additional 2,400 Guard troops along the U.S.-Mexico border and more than 28,000 deployed overseas

August 2020 Gov. Baker Has Deployed the National Guard in Massachusetts. National Guardsmen have been present in Massachusetts twice already in 2020. Once in March during the earliest stages of the response to the coronavirus pandemic.

NATIONAL GUARD ASSISTS RESPONSE TO THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

Governors in 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam and the U.S. Virgin Islands have activated components of their Army and Air National Guard, the reserve component of the U.S military. As many as 44,500 troops have been activated across the nation to assist efforts to respond to, mitigate and control the COVID-19 pandemic, according to a recent Military Times count.

- Members of the National Guard aid in key efforts including:
- Supporting community-based testing sites.
- Creating enhanced medical capacity.
- Facilitating logistical support and transportation of key supplies.
- Assisting in state emergency operations centers.
- Providing labor for call centers.
- Packaging and distributing food and other supplies,
- Building facilities such as medical field hospitals.
- Cleaning and disinfecting common spaces.

The National Guard serves a dual state and federal role. The guards are state organizations and state laws give governors the authority to activate them to respond to domestic emergencies such as natural disasters, civil disturbances and the like. The forces are organized by units and members possess specific occupational specialties such as combat, medical, security, aviation and engineering, among others. The president can also call up the National Guard to support war efforts and national emergencies. In this case, state governors have first acted to mobilize their guards under state active duty status.

POST 9/11 GI BILL®

You may be able to get benefits through the Post-9/11 GI Bill[®] if you've served on active duty for at least 90 days, whether continuous (all at once) or interrupted (for shorter periods over time), after September 10, 2001.

For those who separated prior to January 2013, the Post 9/11 GI Bill[®] benefits generally expire after 15 years, they are expiring every day.

For those who had Chapter 30, the MGIB-AD, there benefits expired after 10 years, but they may be eligible for the Post 9/11 GI Bill[®]. <u>https://www.va.gov/education</u>

VETERAN DESIGNATION ON DRIVER'S LICENSES

All Massachusetts residents who are Veterans of the U.S. Armed Forces and were honorably discharged can choose to have a Veteran's Indicator on their Driver's License, Learner's Permit, Massachusetts ID card, or Liquor ID card.

The Veterans History Project (VHP) of the Library of Congress American Folklife Center collects and preserves the firsthand interviews and narratives of United States military veterans from World War I through the present.

In addition to audio- and video-recorded oral history interviews, VHP accepts memoirs and collections of original photographs, letters, diaries, maps and other historical documents from veterans who served in the US armed services from World War I through the present.

VHP also collects oral histories with Gold Star Family members, defined as a parent, spouse, sibling, or child of members of the Armed Forces who died as a result of their service during a period of war.








Westfield State University

Westfield State University is an education leader committed to providing students of every generation with a learning experience built on its founding principle as the first co-educational college in America to offer an education without barrier to race, gender or economic status. This spirit of innovative thinking and social responsibility is forged in a curriculum of liberal arts and professional studies that creates a vital community of engaged learners who become confident, capable individuals prepared for leadership and service to society.

Founded in 1839 by Horace Mann, WSU was the first public coeducational school for teacher education in the U.S. The school is opened in Barre, Mass. as Normal School for teacher training. "The most important ingredient in the formula of success is knowing how to get along with other people." — Horace Mann

Under the direction of Interim President Roy H. Saigo, this year we are focused on three operational principles:

- 1. We honor the mission of our founder Horace Mann regardless of wealth, gender, ethnicity, or religion, all are welcome.
- 2. We focus on educating our students as if they are our own family members.
- 3. The role of the administration is to support our faculty and staff as they teach and care for our students.

In 2013, Evelyn Dina 16', Emily Ellis '16, Paul Falcone '16 and Alaina Leary '15 created a project proposal to implement a "Veteran's Sanctuary" here on campus as part of a civic engagement course taught by Catherine Savini (who was the Director of the Reading and Writing Center). In 2014, Lisa Ducharme, the newly appointed Veteran & Military Services coordinator was presented with the proposal to have a one-stop service center for those who are military connected. She worked closely with Charles "Chuck" Towse '13, 'M16 to bring the vision to fruition in 2017. After gaining the support of both of the interim University President (Elizabeth Preston) and the newly appointed University President (Ramon S. Torrecilha), by the end of 2015, the design process of creating the Military Community Excellence Center (MCEC) was ready to begin. The Center received a donation from the Holyoke Police Department before funding was approved by the State, conceptually foreshadowing the success that the center would have in the future. The University was fortunate to have the efforts of our legislators, who sponsored and supported the request for funding. Senator Donald Humason and Representative John Velis worked closely with the Westfield State Foundation.

The Veteran & Military Services Office was moved from the Horace Mann Building to Bates Hall in February 2017, creating the Military Community Excellence Center that exists today. The Center relies on collaboration with on-campus resources and offices and off-campus military and veteran resources such as the American Legion, VA Healthcare and Veterans Inc. The creative drive of our students who developed the initiative to plan out an interactive center for peers to utilize truly captures the Westfield student's desire to better the world around them, a characteristic that this center not only promotes, but cultivates. MCEC takes pride in helping students learn how to utilize the resources they have around them, such as skills review, career exploration, and counseling/academic services. The Center also brings in representatives from the Disabled American Veterans, Consumer Credit Counseling, and more for one-on-one counseling and information sessions. The student truly becomes part of a larger community here, having the opportunities to take part in various workshops and events, while expanding their own networks as they engage!
