Final Research Public Service Announcement Presentation Family Crisis Analysis and Family Policy

Power Point Public Service Announcements:

Students are required to submit a power point or short video public service announcement on

an issue that impacts families today. Students may elect to work in teams of two on these final projects. An indication of your topic will be

due the second week into the class.

You will be required to create a power point public service announcement that investigates and carefully

examines some aspect of societal breakdown that impacts families today. You are required to give background information on your problem and the evidence that the crisis

exists today. Outline the policies that you think would best address the problem and why. You may use social policy already in place, look cross culturally, or go out on a limb

and create your own. Details for the final are described in the course in detail.
