COURSE DESCRIPTION:

We are going to analyze money, the banking system, financial markets, and economic activity. The course presents the nature of money and the role of commercial banking in an historical context, as well as inflation, budget deficits, the yield curve, the stock market, the gold standard, balance of payments, exchange rates, portfolio theory, and the role of the Federal Reserve System in the U.S. economy. Prerequisite: ECON 101.



There are two closed-books exams, one midterm and one final exam. These exams **must be taken in a monitored environment on the days they are assigned** or with the Respondus Lockdown browser.
