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I. Course Description

Spanish III is the <u>third</u> semester course in the Spanish sequence, designed to help students attain proficiency at an <u>intermediate</u> level in comprehending, speaking, reading, and writing Spanish, through a task-oriented approach to language acquisition.

Prerequisite: LSPA 0102, or two semesters of college-level, or two years of high-level Spanish.

II. Course Objectives

Upon **<u>successful</u>** completion of this course, the student will be able to perform proficiently, at a low-intermediate level, in the following language skills: listening, speaking, reading, and writing. It also aims at raising the student's awareness to the complexities of the cultures of the Spanish-speaking world, including those of communities in the United States.
