This is an entirely online version of "Principles of Sociology," a college-level introduction to the fundamental concepts of group behavior, major social institutions, principal theoretical perspectives, and the nature of sociological research. Topics to be covered include (but are not limited to): the development of the discipline of sociology, components of culture, socialization, research methods, questions of sex and gender, and of social stratification and inequality.

"Principles of Sociology" is part of the Common Core of Studies at WSU and counts as 3 of the 12 required credits in the Common Core Social Section.

Students will take part in weekly group discussions, take a short quiz each week, and during the term will write a 5-7 page research paper and a 1-2 page reflection essay.

Our textbook will be: James M. Henslin. *Sociology: A Down-to-Earth Approach* (Fourteenth Edition, Pearson, 2019). It's available for purchase or rental in hardcover and digital versions through the WSU Bookstore. Students will also need access to a good computer.
